Maternity Care Program Overview

Maternity Care Program Facts

- Established in 1988 under the 1915(b) Waiver Authority
- Currently administered under a Request for Proposal-released in July 2015
- The state is divided into 14 districts
- Waiver services are administered in 13 of the 14 districts
- One district (District 10) is administered under a fee-for-service reimbursement methodology
- Primary Contractors in 13 districts contract with the Alabama Medicaid Agency for the provision maternity services
- Primary Contractors subcontract with physicians, anesthesiologists and others to establish an adequate network for their district
- Pregnant recipients must enroll in a District Plan (Primary Contractors) for maternity services

Maternity Recipients

Services

- Recipients receiving routine maternity services under a District Plan (Primary Contractor)-services are paid under a global capitation payment methodology.
- Recipients receiving routine and high risk care from Teaching Physicians (University of Alabama at Birmingham and University of South Alabama)-services are paid fee-for-service.
- Recipients receiving high risk care from a Board certified Perinatologist-services are paid fee-for-service.
- Separately Billable Services-home visit(contraceptive counseling), outpatient emergency services, SBIRT, referrals to specialties, tobacco cessation counseling, etc.,-services are paid fee-for-service.

Eligibility Groups

The following recipients are required to participate and should be enrolled:

- Those certified under the Affordable Care Act using the Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) rules for pregnant women
 - Those certified through the Parent Other Caretaker Relative (POCR)
 - Refugees
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI) eligible women Parents of Other Caretakers-Full coverage

The following recipients are not required to participate and should not be enrolled:


- Dual eligibles (Medicare/Medicaid)
- Individuals granted emergency Medicaid due to their non-citizen status
 - DYS women with a county code of 69


Before July 1, 2017

- Primary Contractor/Other Providers




After July 1, 2017
